BRUCE GANDY

Began playing pipes in 1970 and after his instructor went to study in Scotland, he went to James Troy for lessons over the next ten years. Lessons often lasted 3 or more hours as he was having so much fun with “Jamie”. During the summers Bruce studied with Bob Hardie and Andrew Wright at their piping school in Idaho.

In 1982, Mr. Gandy moved to Ontario to join the 78th Fraser Highlanders Pipe Band. It was with the Fraser’s he matured as a player, and composer. During his 15 years with the Frasers, he played in Scotland every year, performed in many concerts, and won a world pipe band championship.

His solo credits include, earning the Gold Medal in 2003 at the Northern Meeting at Inverness, the Gold Medal at the Argyllshire Gathering at Oban in 2004, the Bratach Gorm and numerous individual honors at competitions such as the Glenfiddich Championship and others.

Mr. Gandy is the composer of 4 books of music

and has released a CD of his playing. He has provided pipe band and individual instruction the past 20 years and is sought after frequently to adjudicate, lead workshops, compete and instruct at summer programs.

8:30—How to Compete and Get Results

9:30—How to Phrase and Play Marches

Class will aid in how to recognize and properly phrase 2/4 competition marches. Interactive class where attendees play tunes, your music is put on an overhead projector and Mr. Gandy teaches improvements in technique and musicality

Afternoon session – Grades 1 & 2

1:00—Masters Class in Light Music – Attendees play tunes, music is put on an overhead projector and Mr. Gandy teaches improvements in technique and musicality

2:30—Masters Class in Piobaireachd – Attendees play variations, music is put on overhead projector and Mr. Gandy teaches standard phrase recognition, interpretation, technique and musicality
